Chapter News In Highlight

ALPHA NORTH

(**Kent-Akron, OH**) In the summer **Zeta Omicron** members and their spouses met at Blossom Music Center for a joint picnic and concert with **Zeta** and Alpha North Province President Katy Schneider. This fall **Zeta Omicron** awarded a \$300 scholarship to Michael Skotko, a trumpet major at the Hugh A. Glauser School of Music of Kent State University. The chapter met on September 15 for their annual potluck dinner and a business meeting at the home of Adele Fussner. Members enjoyed time shared discussing their summer activities. On October 13, **Zeta Omicron** held their second meeting of the year at the home of President Michelle Worthing with co-hostess Sara Burky. The two hostesses also performed at the meeting. **Zeta Omicron** chapter members have continued to donate to the Safer Futures of Kent, Ohio, an organization that offers a safe house to women and children from abusive homes. Donations to the organization are made into “goodie bags” containing toiletries, school supplies, and small toys. (**Cleveland, OH**) In April **Zeta Sigma** awarded a \$500 scholarship to Kent State University student Eric Johnston. Eric performed for the chapter, accompanied by **Zeta Sigma** Gloria Wharton. In May **Zeta Sigma** celebrated their 50th anniversary at their annual spring luncheon. In July the chapter and spouses enjoyed a picnic and attended a Cleveland Orchestra concert at Blossom Music Center. In September member Ann Droste hosted a potluck dinner and meeting in her garage. At the October 17 meeting, chapter members performed various pieces in a “Potpourri” recital. Composers of the pieces performed include Giulio Caccini, Stephen Foster, George Frideric Handel, Katherine Hoover, and Eugénie Rocherolle.

Participants painted pumpkins that were donated to Sunrise Nursing Home for Halloween and fall decorations. **Mu** hosted several social rush events this fall including a mix-and-mingle with snacks, painting tiles and mugs and dipping caramel apples while costumed. (**Cincinnati, OH**) In August **Zeta Gamma** and **Zeta Iota** met at General Butler State Park in Carrolton, Kentucky for the celebration of the chapters’ 18-year reunion. For the day, two chapters enjoyed lunch and fellowship. **Zeta Gamma** members spent some time together at the home of Judy Windsor Moore and were treated to “A Few Minutes of Jazz” with chapter patron Robert Schaffer at the piano. The chapter also offers valet parking for all Carlos Moseley Chamber Music Series concerts. In September the chapter hosted the first annual School of the Arts Picnic. 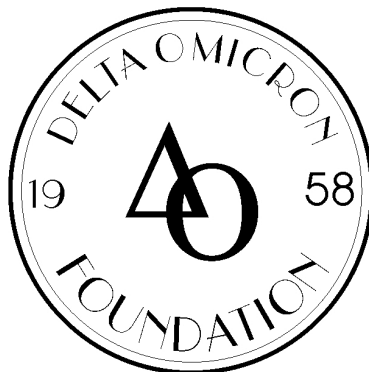
