

Tuesday, July 21 INBOUND TRAVEL

As participants will be converging upon London from all parts of the United States, you will be responsible for arranging your own air transportation to London. Please plan to arrive on July 21, 2020 (note that many flights to London are redeye flights that arrive the next day - for example, depart Chicago O'Hare in the afternoon on July 20, 2020 and arrive London Heathrow in the morning on July 21, 2020).

Upon arrival, make your way to the hotel via your preferred method of transportation. Uber, Lyft, taxi, and rail service may be viable options depending on your arrival airport. London is served by three main airports - Heathrow (the largest), Gatwick, and Stansted. Smaller airports include London City, Luton, and Southend.

Upon arrival, report to the hotel for registration and check-in. For flights arriving earlier in the day, your hotel rooms may not be available until later.
